INFORMATION FOR CORONIAL WITNESSES

WITNESSES SHOULD READ THIS NOTICE CAREFULLY

Entitlement to Expenses

Witnesses who are out of pocket as a result of their attendance at the Coroners Court are entitled to receive compensation for loss of earnings, travelling and sustenance. Other special allowances may be considered in unusual circumstances. No compensation or allowances will be paid to a witness who does not suffer monetary loss by reason of their attendance at Court.

The maximum amount which can be paid for loss of earnings is \$77.70

How to Claim

Claims for loss of earnings by employees should be supported by a letter in writing by the employer showing the actual amount deducted from the witness' salary or wages due to his/her absence from work. Claims for loss of earnings for self-employed persons should be supported by some evidence of loss such as a letter from his/her accountant. All claims are subject to verification by the Coronial Division.

Claims for travelling allowances or sustenance are paid pursuant to the Tasmanian State Service Award and must be accompanied by receipts. Use should be made of public transport but a private vehicle may be used so long as the overall expenses are not thereby increased. The present reimbursement rate for travel in own motor vehicle is set by the Tasmanian State Service Award, Part IV, Clause 3(d)(ii) and (iii), Occasional user.

Claims for witness' expenses in the Coroners Court should be presented to the clerk of that court.
